

Boys talking about college classes:


A: There's these dumb tall black dudes in my class, and they don't know anything, and they're poor. They're only here because they're good at basketball.

A group of students gathering to go out one night.


A: What jacket are you gonna wear, dude?

Oh, you mean like a semester of college or something?




Charlie's girlfriend came to his college house to visit him, and brought all her laundry. Water is an extra utility expense at this house. Charlie's roommate asked:

B: What do you mean? I can see homeless people everyday, there is one right here...


A: He can't be homeless. He doesn't have a sleeping bag...

Zoe grew up in a town of mostly Upper-middle class residents, and she is discussing her new boyfriend, Hunter.


A: I mean it's weird, he doesn't have a car, and he keeps working to pay for his textbooks. His parents are so mean. Why don't they pay for it?
